**Regulations to Conduct an Internal Eligibility Assessment for Applicants to the Bilinguale Informatik /Bilingual Bachelor's Degree Program (BiBa) in Computer Science**

On the basis of §§ 27 Section 6 of the Universities Act of the State of Saxony-Anhalt in the version published on July 1, 2021 (GVBl. LSA pp. 368, 369), Otto-von-Guericke University of Magdeburg adopted the following regulations governing the internal procedures for the Eligibility Assessment for the Bilingual Bachelor's Degree Program (BiBa) in Computer Science.

**§ 1**

**Applicability of these Regulations**

These regulations, together with the currently valid Study- and Examination Regulations (SPO), are applicable to the process of Eligibility Assessment for the Bilingual Bachelor's Degree Program (BiBa) in the Faculty of Computer Science at Otto-von-Guericke University of Magdeburg.

**§ 2**

**Participation in the proceedings and additional documentation to be submitted**

- (1) Anyone who has applied for a spot in the program in a timely and proper manner and meets the formal admission criteria set forth in the currently valid Study- and Examination Regulations (SPO) is automatically included in the eligibility assessment process. No separate application for participation is required from the applicant.

- (2) In addition to the documents required as part of the application for admission, applicants must submit any available documentation for the assessment of the criteria listed in §5:
- Proof of special aptitude for the degree program: internships, professional activities, certificates, participation in competitions relevant to the degree program or further experiences relevant to the study course.
  - If the university entrance qualification was attained outside of Germany, a TestAS.
  - Proof of the relevant level of German proficiency, provided it exceeds the level required in the Study Regulations. The OVGU's Reference Framework for Language Proficiency explains the options for demonstrating language proficiency.

### § 3

#### Committee for the Eligibility Assessment

- (1) In accordance with the Study- and Examination Regulations, the Board of Examiners of the Faculty of Computer Science appoints a committee to determine Eligibility of applicants for the Bilingual Bachelor's degree program (BiBa) in Computer Science. Members of the Committee are two university faculty members (persons authorized to conduct examinations in accordance with state law). Further members may be appointed by the Board of Examiners.
- (2) The Committee for Eligibility Assessment is responsible for the organization and implementation of the eligibility assessment. It shall carry out the tasks assigned to it by these regulations.

### § 4

#### Procedure for Determining Eligibility

- (1) The Committee decides whether an applicant is suitable on the basis of the criteria specified in §5.
- (2) Based on the submitted documents, the committee evaluates each applicant on a scale of 0 to a maximum of 16 points.
- (3) The number of points earned determines whether an applicant can be deemed eligible based on the submitted documents.
- (4) If applicants score at least 8 points, they are immediately eligible for the program. Applicants who score less than 8 points are considered ineligible.

### §5

#### Eligibility Assessment

- (1) The determination of an applicant's Eligibility is based on the submitted documents and a score determined as follows:
- (a) Average grade (based on term grades and the Abitur exam, if applicable) as indicated on the university entrance qualification (HZB) obtained in Germany, per subject, in mathematics, computer science, and the natural sciences (physics, biology, chemistry) (maximum 6 points)

Grade	Points
13 to 15 Gradepoints	3

10 to 12 Gradepoints	2
07 to 09 Gradepoints	1

OR

For university entrance qualifications from abroad, the TestAS score for both the core module and the subject-specific module (maximum 6 points)

TestAS Score (digital TestAS)	Standard value (paperbased TestAS)	Points
>= 150	>=110	3
>= 100	>=100	2
>= 50	>=90	1

(b) Proof of special aptitude for the degree program (maximum 5 points)

Previous activities	Score
Relevant working experience (internships, employment) - <i>only with proof from the employer</i>	1 point per 6 months
Relevant internationally recognized certificates (e.g., Microsoft Certified Professional, Oracle Certified Java) or other relevant experience (e.g., successful participation in competitions)	1 point each

(c) German knowledge (maximum 5 points) - not cumulative

Language Skills	Points
German A2	1
German B1	3
German B2	5

## § 6

### Determination of the Result

- (1) Applicants who score at least 8 out of 16 points on the criteria set forth in §5 Section1 (a) through (c) have demonstrated their eligibility for the program and will be admitted to the program, subject to meeting the general admission requirements as specified in the current Study Regulations.
- (2) The results of the eligibility assessment will be communicated to applicants by the faculty and are valid for one year.
- (3) Applicants who have not achieved the minimum score may reapply. Since they do not currently meet the admission requirements for the program, they will receive a notice stating that their enrollment has been denied (see § 29(2) HSG LSA).

## § 7 Date Regulation Takes Effect

These regulations take effect on the day after their publication in the official announcements of Otto-von-Guericke University of Magdeburg.

They are issued on the basis of the resolutions adopted by the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Computer Science of 14.01.2026 and acknowledged by the Senate of Otto-von-Guericke University of Magdeburg of 25.02.2026.
